ACE THE PERFECT TRAVEL ALBUM



American travel photographer and blogger, **Trey Ratcliff**, shares tips and tricks to make your photo-sharing visually compelling.

LANDSCAPE AND PEOPLE For landscapes, have something interesting in the foreground. For people shots, be sure to get close to the eyes. They are just about all that matters.

MOBILE FOOD PHOTOGRAPHY 1) Get in low, and try not to shoot from a straight-down angle. 2) Get close to the most interesting part of the food and tap on your screen to just focus on that. If you're lucky, everything else will be out of focus and it will look very artsy. 3) Try not to use a filter like you do for your people and landscape photos. Most filters make the food look a bit dingy and unappetising.

SHOOTING IN BAD WEATHER If the weather is bad, focus on details such as cool signs or interesting lights. You can also do things like get close to water droplets on glass and just tap your screen to focus on those. Or even better, pop into an interesting interior and find pretty little things!

GO-TO PHOTO APPS I might be partial, but I use 100 Cameras in 1 [for iPhone]. There's a free version and a paid version with 100 filters for you to use. On Android, the editing app



Snapseed is the way to go. **SHARE ON THE GO** Google+ is a great way for me to share my images because I can share them with the public or just with family and friends. It's also pretty slick because even if my whole family doesn't use Google+, it sends them an e-mail with the latest photo! If you're with friends and using Google+, it gets even better. You can create an "Event" for the trip and go into "Party Mode" – all the photos you take automatically go into the event and are shared online with all other participants. It's fun to see multiple views of the event streaming in, all in real time!

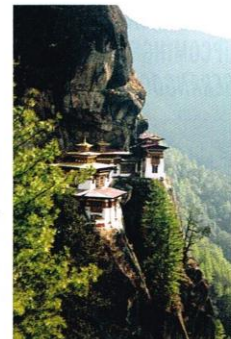
